CAROTEL AND TAR HEEL CHAPTER SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS NOW BEING ACCEPTED

Scholarship applications are being accepted now for the 2023 Tar Heel Chapter Scholarship and Carotel's *Elizabeth Bland Memorial Scholarship*. Applicants for both scholarships must be enrolled in a graduate or undergraduate program in any field at an accredited college or university and must have maintained a 3.0 GPA for the most recent completed year (high school or college.)

Students applying for the Tar Heel Chapter scholarship must submit their completed application to the scholarship committee chairman by **May 30.** To be eligible for this scholarship, applicants must be sponsored by a Tar Heel Chapter Pioneer or a member of a club in the Tar Heel Chapter in good standing with the ITPA (2023 member dues paid, if applicable). Carotel Pioneer Club members and families of club members are eligible to apply for the *Elizabeth Bland Memorial Scholarship*. Carotel members must be current on their annual membership dues in order to apply or to sponsor an applicant.
