Most of us think about Valentine's Day when we think of February, but this short month is packed full of other significant events. "February" is named after the Roman festival of purification called Februa. The festival name itself was derived from the Latin word "Februare," which means "to purify." During the "Februa" festival, conducted on February 15th, participants made offerings and sacrifices to purify themselves and their environment.

February is also the month in which the calendar year is synchronized with the solar year. Solar years last about 365.24 days. Adding a day to February every four years synchronizes our calendar with the solar year. However, if that year is divisible by 100 but not by 400, leap year is omitted.

Another interesting fact about February is that while many of us in the United States are in the midst of winter, the month of February is actually the hottest month of the year in the Southern Hemisphere.

February has several notable holidays and events, including:

- ♦ Groundhog Day (February 2) If a groundhog emerges from its burrow and sees its shadow, there will be six more weeks of winter weather.
- February 11 International Day of Women and Girls in Science In 2016, the UN declared a national date on which to encourage more women and girls to pursue jobs in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).
- ♦ February 14 Valentine's Day, first celebrated in 496 AD, originated as a Christian feast honoring a martyr named Valentine.
- National Black History Month Nationally expanded to one month in the 1970's, the recognition of Black Americans' significant historical contributions began in 1926 as a week-long recognition of Black Americans' accomplishments throughout history.

February is a significant month for U.S. statehood. Massachusetts was admitted to the union as the 6th state on February 6, 1788. Maine became the 23rd state on February 15, 1820. Oregon became the 33rd state on February 14, 1859. Arizona became the 48th state on February 14, 1912. Oklahoma became the 46th state on November 16, 1907. Mississippi was readmitted to the Union on February 23, 1870, after having seceded from the United States during the Civil War. HAPPY FEBRUARY!

Emmett L. Tatum. Jr., age passed away on January 22, 2025. **Emmett** born was in Edgecombe County on July 6, 1928, to parents Emmett Blanche Fryer Tatum, now deceased.

Emmett was also preceded in death by his beloved wife Denative Poland Tatum, daughter Lenae June Tatum and sister Blanche Trent.

Emmett has a large and loving family with whom he left a lifetime of treasured memories. His daughter Lynette Tatum resides in Rocky Mount. Daughter Joella T. Webb and her husband Bruce reside in Nashville. Son Duncan Emmett Tatum and his wife reside in Rocky Mount.

Emmett also left behind six grandchildren and five great grandchildren who put a smile on his face whenever he saw them. Grandchildren are Sharon Webb, Amy Webb Trull (Josh), Brandon Johnson, Adam Johnson (Jessica), Collin Tatum, Blake Tatum, and Jamal Bullock. Greatgrandchildren are Kyle and Owen Trull, Aiden, Grace and Nathan.

A memorial service was held on January 26th at Oakdale Baptist Church in Rocky Mount. Emmett was interred on January 27th at Pineview Cemetery, Rocky Mount. Memorial donations may be made to Oakdale Baptist Church.

Emmett was a Carolina Telephone and Telegraph Company retiree and was an avid Carotel supporter. In memory of Emmett, we are revisiting a prior "Member Spotlight" segment that featured Emmett.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT SHINES ON EMMETT TATUM

For the first time in many years, Emmett Tatum wasn't able to attend our 2024 Carotel Convention that he looked forward to each year. Emmett celebrated his 96th birthday on July 6, 2024, and he wasn't as spry as he once was, but he did enjoy spending his birth-



day with one of his daughters at White Lake, as has been an annual tradition.

Emmett graduated from Rocky Mount High School and worked for Carolina Telephone & Telegraph Company from 1949 until he enlisted in the military in September 1950.



After receiving an honorable discharge in September 1952, Emmett resumed his telephony career, during which time worked as an installer and a central office technician.

Emmett married sweetheart, his Denative Poland, in May 1951. Their love story began with a double date. Emmett's best friend Sonny was dating Denative's sister at the time, and **Emmett** worked up the courage to ask Denative out.





Sonny and Denative's sister didn't last, but Emmett and Denative found true love. The couple had three daughters and one son.

Emmett's daughter JoElla, who accompanied Emmett to our Carotel Conventions for the last couple of years that he attended, recalled of Emmett that he at times

worked two or three jobs so that Denative could stay home with their growing family. Their oldest daughter, LeNae, died on December 25, 1959, with leukemia. Denative passed away on February 14, 1998, just shy of the couple's 47th wedding anniversary.

Emmett always loved airplanes and flying. He and his best buddy Sonny Williams flew a Cessna and a Piper Cub, and they frequented air shows by the Thunderbirds and the Blue Angels. Emmett took his family to some of those shows, and his daughter JoElla remembers going to Virginia once or twice for an air show.

Emmett also loved to bowl and bowled every week in a league until just a few years ago. He also loved a good bingo game and was a member of his local senior Center.

It's no secret that Emmett also loved to dance. Even after he couldn't drive himself to the dances, his daughter provided his transportation to and from the dances until recent years when his health didn't allow. Emmett also loved dancing when he attended the annual Carotel convention.



To receive the special room rate of \$125 plus tax for Thursday (optional) and Friday/Saturday nights, ask for the *Carotel Club* or *ITPA Carotel Club* group rate. (Room includes two double beds. If you prefer a room with one king size bed, the per night rate is \$135.)

Carotel is affiliated with the ITPA Tar Heel Chapter in Region 3. All Carotel Pioneers are invited and encouraged to participate in our state chapter activities and events. The national ITPA was founded in 1920 by members of the independent telecommunications industry as a way to serve the communities they lived and worked in.

The Carotel Club was formed on July 1, 1971 under the previously existing Tar Heel Chapter. The club initially consisted of members who were employed by Carolina Telephone and Telegraph Company and required 15 years of service as a condition of membership. Over the years, the club's by-laws were revised, as companies were merged and acquired, to welcome Sprint and Embarq telecommunications associates, and the required length of service was reduced. In recent years, a new membership category was adopted by the ITPA to allow "Friends of Pioneers" to become Pioneers. And we need new members! Invite someone today.
