CAROTEL PROJECT UPDATES

Carotel's Pioneers continued their ongoing tradition of collecting food and toiletries during the annual Carotel Convention in October. Non-perishable food items were collected for Martha's Mission Cupboard, an emergency food bank in Morehead City, NC. Food, toiletries and pop tabs were collected for Ronald McDonald House of Eastern NC.

Convention attendees were generous with their donations. More than 20 pounds of pop tops were collected equating to nearly 25,000 pop tops.



Toiletries and non-perishable food items for Ronald McDonald House filled an entire table.

More than 300 pounds of nonperishable food items were donated for Martha's Mission Cupboard, an emergency food pantry run solely by volunteers to provide temporary emergency food assistance to families in financial crisis. Every client ideally receives cereal, canned fruit and vegetable, dried beans, rice, grits, saltines, peanut butter, jelly, powered milk, cooking oil, eggs, margarine, orange juice, hot dogs, chickens, bread and rolls, soap, laundry detergent and toilet paper plus other extras that are donated.





Pioneers who attended the convention generously contributed items for the club's silent and live auctions, and generously bid on those items, raising more than \$1,300 for the Elizabeth Bland Memorial Scholarship fund. Many of the items donated were home-baked goods and hand-made arts and crafts. Thanks to Ronnie Cashwell for serving as auctioneer for the event and to Chester Harrell for assisting.





August 2-4, 1999 – This year, Food Lion will be having their annual Food Drive on August 2-4, 1999. Community Way Days Voucher must be presented to the cashier at the beginning of the grocery scanning process. The system automatically calculates 5% of the total retail order, before coupons and discounts have been deducted and tax added. In addition to the 5% of the total retail order, the Independent Telephone Pioneer Association will receive an additional \$0.25 for each shopper who purchases at least one MVP product and has their MVP card scanned.


INCREASE IN ITPA DUES: The ITPA dues will increase from \$15.00 to \$20.00 for the calendar year 2000.

COMING SOON - CAROLINA TELEPHONE MUSEUM

Co-chairmen Bruce Joyner and Walter White have reported that the Carotel Museum Committee is finalizing plans to open a "Museum of Telephony" within the next two months. The project, jointly sponsored by Carolina Telephone Pioneers (Carotel Club) and Sprint, will be located within the Imagination Station Science Museum at 204 Nash Street, Wilson, NC. In addition to the usual historic artifacts, displays, etc., the museum will feature a working Step-by-Step central office switching system and a modern technology computer room – both with "hands on" demonstration capabilities. A Grand Opening celebration is being organized and is expected to be held during September, 1999.

This project will culminate a long term effort by the Carotel Club to establish a permanent home for the many items collected and stored in Tarboro and Fayetteville over the years. Like other parts of the Imagination Station, it is expected to draw wide attention and attendance by visiting school groups, scouting units, etc. as well as the general public. It should be of special interest to the many active and retired telephone employees in our area. Stay tuned for more detailed information to be provided as the Grand Opening event draws nearer.
